Idayat puts Nina's hands on her hands so she can feel the yarn and needles. Nina has created her own network; now, if she does not attend a Friday session, the group misses her.

Senior Support Worker Cori Barger has also been working with Nina to enrich her life with music. With sound therapy, Nina has been able to reduce her reliance on medication and greatly improved her everyday life.
